Important Reminder:

As the 2018-19 school year begins we would like to remind parents of the absentee procedure:

Please call 382-3459 and leave a message before 9:00 am for your child's absence, if this call or prior notice is not taken your child's absence will be marked <u>unexcused</u>. Students will be considered tardy if they are not in their classroom before the bell rings at the beginning of each school day. 2 tardies will result in a warning letter home to parents, 3-8 tardies student will receive a lunch detention, 9-12 tardies student receive one hour detention after school, and 13+ tardies results in possible suspension.

These are the requirements for Georgetowne Middle School Students 2018-19 school year

Meningococcal Conjugate Vaccine (MCV): All children entering the 6th grade shall show proof of having received 1 dose of Meningococcal Conjugate Vaccine.

<u>Hepatitis B</u>: All children entering the 6th grade shall show proof of having received 3 doses of hepatitis B vaccine.

Rubella: Any child entering a school at any grade level must show proof of having 2 doses of live rubella virus vaccine.

<u>Mumps</u>: Any child entering a school at any grade level must show proof of having 2 doses of live mumps virus vaccine.

<u>Varicella</u>: Any child entering kindergarten, SIXTH, or NINTH grade must show proof of having 2 doses of varicella vaccine.

<u>Tdap:</u> All Children entering 6th grade are required to show proof of receipt of one dose of Tdap vaccine (containing tetanus, diphtheria, acellular pertussis)

Physical Examination: Sixth grade entering into GMS must have a current physical examination

<u>Diabetes Screening</u>: All SIXTH grade shall show proof of having a diabetes screening (this is usually done at the time of the physical examination)

The Origins of Halloween
