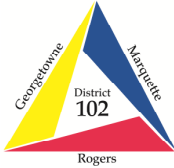

From the Superintendent's Desk

After several years operating without a budget, the state of Illinois has now passed a budget for the second straight year. The new budget provides for \$350 million in new funding for the evidence-based school funding model, a model which last year replaced the old General State Aid formula for funding schools. The new budget also includes \$50 million for early childhood education. The funding for early childhood education is news the District had been waiting to receive. Within days of the budget being approved, the District received notification that its Pre-K program at Marquette School would be approved (after a rigorous re-application process) and would be fully-funded for the upcoming year. The education funding levels in the state budget also show the state's commitment to education that had been absent in previous year's budgets. As you may recall, for several years, the state had prorated its General State Aid payments, resulting in over \$1 million in lost General State Aid from 2011 through 2016 for District 102.

As the start of another school year approaches, the District continues its annual summer cleaning and maintenance. At Georgetown School, multiple rooms with old carpeting are being upgraded with new carpet tiles, replacing the old rollout carpeting. The carpeting in these rooms was buckling or had large gaps in the seams, creating a tripping hazard. In addition, all of the 40-year old window panes at GMS have also been replaced with new Low-E insulated glass panes. Many of the old panes had broken seals and were foggy. At Rogers School, the District is upgrading the library, converting it into a 20th century learning space. New shelving for books and storage are being added. Old carpeting is being replaced with café-style vinyl flooring. Instead of having a space just for checking out books or using the computer lab, the area is being redesigned to allow for greater flexibility for class projects, including STEM projects (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math). All the upgrades and maintenance are moving along as planned and should be completed by the time school starts again in August.

Over the summer, the district is also working to increase its technology infrastructure and its level of technology. Using money from the ESEA Title I Grant, the district will add over 70 iPad and/or Chromebooks to the three buildings as we work to create an environment where we average close to one device per student. If you recall from previous newsletters and communications, a Chromebook is a different breed of laptop. Instead of using a Windows or Mac operating system, Chromebooks run Google's Chrome operating system. These machines are designed to be used primarily while connected to the internet, with most applications and documents living in the cloud. Chromebooks are specifically designed for the Google Apps for Education Suite. Google Apps for Education, GAFE, is a set of communication and collaboration tools that includes email, calendar, and documents. In addition to adding devices, the district will also add 15 wireless access points to the buildings to increase wireless access needed to handle the increased number of devices. Up to 60% of the cost for the new devices will be covered by the federal E-rate reimbursement program.

The District 102 Board continues to monitor its local tax rate in comparison with other local elementary districts that feed into Pekin High School. Based on information published by Tazewell County in its recent handbook entitled **2017 Assessed Valuations and Rates for Taxes Payable in 2018**, District 102's tax rate for the current year is 3.0042%. It continues to be among lowest rate of the five elementary school districts that feed into Pekin High School District 303. Those remaining four districts include South Pekin 137 (2.9876%), Pekin 108 (3.2495%), Spring Lake 606 (3.7018%) and Rankin 98 (3.8528%).



Pre-Kindergarten at Risk Screening

Pre-Kindergarten screening is scheduled on Monday, August 6 and Tuesday, August 7, 2018. You will need to make an appointment for this screening. We will have the screening schedule available at registration on July 30 and 31, 2018. Children must be 3 years old by September 1, 2018 and **NOT** age eligible to go to kindergarten to be screened for this school year. (If your child was screened in the spring and placed on the waiting list you do not need to have your child screened again.) If you are unable to come to registration, please call Marquette Elementary School at 382-3612 anytime Wednesday, August 1, 2018 for an appointment.

Kindergarten Screening for new students

Marquette Elementary School will conduct screenings for new kindergarten age children that are new to the district who were not screened last Spring. DISTRICT 102 SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Many community members, as well as parents, may not be aware of all the special services and programs offered by the North Pekin – Marquette Heights School District. Many of these programs, or services, are open to community members from ages three to twenty-one. These services include special testing for three and four year olds who may have a speech or language problem, or if the parent feels there may be a concern because of the developmental progress of their child. In such a case, district personnel could evaluate the child for speech and language services, or possible placement in an early childhood program. Students who are currently enrolled in the local schools also have access to the many special programs that the district provides. These programs include, but are not limited to, special education classes for learning disability students, classes for students with behavior problems, services for students with speech or language deficits, as well as programs for students with visual or physical handicaps.

In addition, the district also complies with the Americans With Disabilities Act, and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973. If you, as a parent, feel your child needs special assistance in these areas, or any other area, please contact your local school office, to set up an appointment to discuss your concerns.

ANNUAL ASBESTOS MANAGEMENT PLAN NOTICE

This is to inform you of the status of the North Pekin-Marquette Heights District 102 asbestos management plans. It has been determined by the Illinois Department of Public Health and the Federal Environmental Protection Agency that asbestos is a potential health hazard, and precautions should be taken to avoid disturbing any asbestos containing materials. As required, our buildings were initially inspected for asbestos in December, 1987. The AHERA law requires that a visual inspection of asbestos containing areas be completed every six months, and a re-inspection conducted every three years. The district’s three-year inspection is scheduled to occur in July, 2019. Any evidence of disturbance or change in condition will be documented in the Management plan as required. The Inspection/Management Plan is available for public review in the District Office located at Georgetownne Middle School, 51 Yates Rd., Marquette Heights. Should you wish to review the plans, please call to make an appointment during normal business hours.

Registration Fees for 2018-2019

Textbook fees for students at Marquette Elementary and Rogers Elementary are \$80.00 per student. For students at Georgetowne Middle School, the fees are \$85.00. Textbook fees should be paid at the time of registration.

A \$5.00 discount will be given for each student if this is paid by September 14, 2018.

Georgetowne Middle School has additional fees for electives or activities that will also be assessed according to specific class assignments. Also, the Board of Education will require students to wear a gown during Eighth Grade Graduation. A fee will be assessed during registration of \$25.00 to cover this cost.

Students wishing to participate in any of the following Georgetowne school activities are required to pay the following participation fees:

\$21.00 for Literary, Scholastic Bowl and Student Council.
\$42.00 for Baseball, Softball, Basketball, Cheerleading, Pom Pons, Volleyball and Track.

Maximum charge per student is \$63.00 and \$126 per family.

All Athletic fees may be waived by the building principal for those approved for a "Waiver of Fees."

At Rogers Elementary School, an additional activity fee for student magazines, assignment notebooks and recorders will be assessed according to grade level.

Marquette Students will have an additional activity fee to offset the costs of magazines, take home folders and a journal for 1st grade students.

CERTIFICATE OF LIVE BIRTH

All kindergarten students and new students to the district are required to provide a Certificate of Live Birth. This can be obtained through the courthouse of the county in which the child was born. The copy from the hospital is not considered a Certificate of Live Birth. Some students who do not have a birth certificate on file may be asked to obtain a **Certificate of Live Birth** as stated in the student's handbook. **This is due into the district no later than the first day of school.**

Registration will be held in the Georgetowne Library. Listed below is some information that will help speed up the registration process. Please read it over and bring all the necessary information with you when you come to register.

ALL kindergarten and sixth grade students are required to have a physical and dental examination upon entering school. All Second grade students are required to have a dental examination upon entering school. The following information is what the health department requires for these students to be in compliance.

KINDERGARTEN REQUIREMENTS

DTaP– FOUR OR FIVE SHOTS WITH THE LAST ONE AFTER THE FOURTH BIRTHDAY

POLIO – THREE OR FOUR SHOTS WITH THE LAST ONE AFTER THE FOURTH BIRTHDAY

MMR – TWO SHOTS GIVEN AFTER THE CHILD IS 15 MONTHS OLD

VARICELLA - CHICKEN POX, IMMUNIZATION OR PROOF OF DISEASE

HEPATITIS B - THREE SHOT SERIES WITH FOUR WEEKS BETWEEN FIRST AND SECOND AND EIGHT WEEKS BETWEEN SECOND AND THIRD SHOT

DIABETES AND LEAD SCREENING ARE MANDATORY VISION AND DENTAL EXAM

OUT OF STATE STUDENTS

The requirements are the same for all immunizations

ALL PHYSICAL AND DENTAL EXAMINATIONS SHOULD BE DATED AFTER SEPTEMBER 1, 2017.

ALL PHYSICALS AND IMMUNIZATIONS MUST BE INTO THE DISTRICT NO LATER THAN OCTOBER 13, 2017 OR YOUR CHILD WILL BE EXCLUDED FROM SCHOOL.

Health Examinations

Public Act 95-0422, effective August 24, 2007, revised the School Code such as that a health examination is required before entering the sixth grade of any public, private, or parochial school as opposed to entering the fifth grade of any public, private, or parochial school.

Dental Exams

Illinois Administrative Code requires all children in kindergarten, second and sixth grades of any public, private, parochial school to have a dental examination



Vision Requirements for Illinois Students

- ◆ Vision screenings are mandatory for second and eighth grade students
- ◆ Vision screenings are recommended for grades 4, 6, 10, and 12
- ◆ Pediatric color screening is now recommended for second grade, rather than first
- ◆ Photo screening has been approved for children under 3 and for children who cannot be screened with traditional screening methods



Vision Examinations

Public Act 95-671, effective Tuesday, January 1, 2008, requires that all children enrolling in kindergarten in a public, private or parochial school and any student enrolling for the first time in a public, private or parochial school shall have an eye examination.

Each such child is to present proof of having been examined by a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches or a licensed optometrist within the previous year before the start of school on August 21, 2017.

BLOOD LEAD POISONING SCREENING REQUIREMENTS

The Blood Lead Poisoning Prevention Act (Public Act #87-1144) requires physicians to screen children, ages six months to six years of age, for lead poisoning. By January 1, 1993, each day care center, day care home, preschool, nursery school, kindergarten or other child care facility, licensed or approved by the State, including such programs operated by a public school district, shall include a requirement that each parent or legal guardian of a child between the ages of six months through six years provide a statement from a physician or health care provider that the child has been screened for lead poisoning. The law requires that this statement shall be provided prior to admission and subsequently, in conjunction with, required physical examinations. The Tazewell County Health Department will provide blood lead testing to those who qualify. If you would like more information on the screening, call Tazewell County Health Department at 309-925-5511 or 309-477-2223.

Pesticide Notification

Periodically the schools will contract with local businesses to apply pesticides or herbicides on school district property. If such applications could cause health problems to you or your family, please notify the district office. Your name will then be put on a list and you will be contacted prior to any pesticide application.

Bus Schedules and School Hours

Scheduling information and school hours will be available at registration. If you have any questions please feel free to ask at that time.



Breakfast Program Continues for 2018-2019 School Year

All three District 102 schools will serve breakfast starting Monday August 20, 2018. The basic menu is the same as last school year:

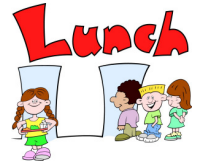
Choice of 3 cereals, 3 different muffins, variety of juices and white milk

Hot breakfast will be available periodically this year. Notices and menus regarding hot breakfast will be posted to our website (www.dist102.org).

The cost for breakfast – hot or cold – is \$2.15 for regular and \$.30 for reduced. Extra muffins and juice may be purchased for \$.35 each. Extra cereal may be purchased. (Not available at Marquette Elementary School) Students who qualify for free lunch will also qualify for free breakfast. Students pay daily. We also ask that lunch money and breakfast money be kept separate and that no child has more than \$13.75 in breakfast and lunch charges.
