## Kindergarten Round-Up

Kindergarten round-up will be held Monday March 23 through Thursday, April 2, 2015, at Marquette School. All children, who turn five years old on or before September 1, 2015, are eligible to enroll in kindergarten for the 2015-2016 school year. Parents or guardians of

these children are invited to register in the school office for the spring screenings.

#### You must bring the students' Certificate of Live Birth to pre-register your child.

It is very important for the students to be pre-registered for kindergarten at this time to plan for fall classes. Kindergarten screening will be held Wednesday, April 15, 2015.

## **Pre-Kindergarten Screening**


North Pekin - Marquette Heights School District #102 will conduct a spring screening for the B.E.A.R.S pre-kindergarten program.

The screening dates are Thursday, May 21 and Friday, May 22, 2015. You may call for an appointment starting March 23, 2015.



The pre-kindergarten classes are held at Marquette Elementary School during the school year. The classes meet Monday through Friday for two and a half hours, either in the morning or afternoon. The classes are limited to 20 students per session. Students are invited to attend this class based on the screening results. The purpose of this class is to provide developmentally appropriate activities for students while preparing them for entrance into kindergarten.

All three and four year old children who reside in the district are eligible for screening. All children must be three by April 1, 2014 to qualify for this screening. Another screening for children, who will be three before school begins, will be held in August, 2014. If you would like to have your child screened, please call the Marquette School office (382-3612) to set an appointment beginning March 23, 2015.



# REGISTRATION FOR 2015-2016

Registration is held in the Georgetowne library. Listed below is some information that will help speed up the registration process. Please read it over and bring all the necessary information with you when you come to register.

<u>ALL</u> kindergarten and sixth grade students are required to have a physical examination upon entering school. The following information is what the health department requires for these students to be in compliance.

#### KINDERGARTEN REQUIREMENTS

CHICKEN POX VACCINATION OR A DOCTOR'S LET-TER INDICATING YOUR CHILD HAS HAD THE CHICK-EN POX.

DPT - FOUR OR FIVE SHOTS WITH THE LAST ONE AFTER THE FOURTH BIRTHDAY

POLIO - THREE OR FOUR SHOTS WITH THE LAST ONE AFTER THE FOURTH BIRTHDAY

MMR - TWO SHOTS GIVEN AFTER THE CHILD IS 15 MONTHS OLD

VISION AND DENTAL EXAM FOR KINDERGARTEN

#### SIXTH GRADE ONLY

HEPATITIS B - THREE SHOTS WITH THE LAST ONE GIVEN SIX MONTHS AFTER THE FIRST ONE

Tdap - TETANUS/DIPHTHERIA/ACELLULAR PERTUSSIS VACINE

DENTAL EXAMS FOR ALL STUDENTS IN GRADES KINDERGARTEN, 2, AND 6.

#### OUT OF STATE STUDENTS

The requirements are the same for all immunizations.

#### **CERTIFICATE OF LIVE BIRTH**

All students are required to provide a Certificate of Live Birth. This is to be obtained through the courthouse of the county in which the child was born. The copy from the hospital is not considered a Certificate of Live Birth. Some students who do not have a birth certificate on file may be asked to obtain a **Certificate of Live Birth** as stated in the student handbook. This must be turned in to the district no later than the first day of school. Textbook fees for students at Marquette Elementary, Rogers Elementary and Georgetowne Middle School will be set this spring. Textbook fees should be paid at the time of registration. A discount will be given for each student that is paid by September 18, 2015.

At Georgetowne Middle School, this fee will include textbook rental fees and student handbook fees. Additional fees for electives or activities will also be assessed according to specific class assignments. If you need more information concerning needed supplies or materials, or the cost of these items, please contact the school office at 382-3456.

At Rogers and Marquette Elementary Schools, an additional activity fee for student magazines, assignment notebooks, recorders or journals will be assessed according to grade level. If you need more information concerning this activity fee, please contact Patty at Rogers Elementary School at 382-3401 or Cindy at Marquette Elementary School at 382-3612.

## **DENTAL EXAMS**

House Bill 752 now requires all children in kindergarten, second and sixth grades of any public, private, or parochial school to have a dental examination. See District webpage





## VISION EXAMS

Effective January 1, 2008, all Illinois children in Kindergarten or upon first entry into an Illinois school beyond kindergarten are required to have an eye examination. This includes all

#### **Enhance the Future Scholarship**

The Enhance the Future Scholarship is for Pekin High School 2015 graduating seniors who have attended North Pekin Marquette Heights Grade Schools for at least 6 years and are accepted at an accredited college or university.

100 percent of the funds donated will be given to the scholarship recipients. Those recipients will be selected by a committee made up of District #102 senior certified staff following the submission of an application and an interview.

Presentation of the scholarship awards will be made at the Georgetowne graduation and the names of donors will be listed at that time.

This is an on-going project, having begun with the pledge from Mr. Perkins (who retired after teaching 39 years in the district). Over the past ten years, beginning in May of 2005, 61 Georgetowne Graduates have received scholarships. Funds already have been pledged for the eleventh annual scholarship. The goal is to raise enough money for four or more scholarships. It is up to the community of the North Pekin Marquette Heights School District to enable us to help more students with your gift to the fund, which is being administered through the Marquette Heights Mens Club.
