





These charts present the overall percentage of state test scores categorized as meeting or exceeding the PARCC expectations, SAT standards or DLM-AA Standards for your district, and the state.










PARCC PERFORMANCE

Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC)
