Homeless students are who do not have permanent and adequate homes.

Chronic truants are students who are absent from school without valid cause for 9 or more of the last 180 school days.

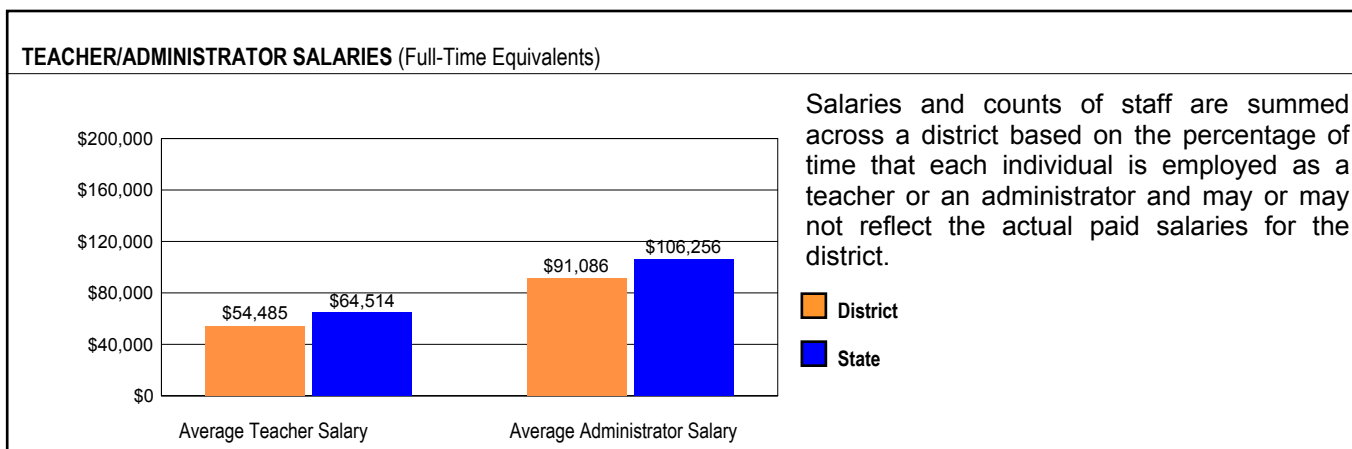

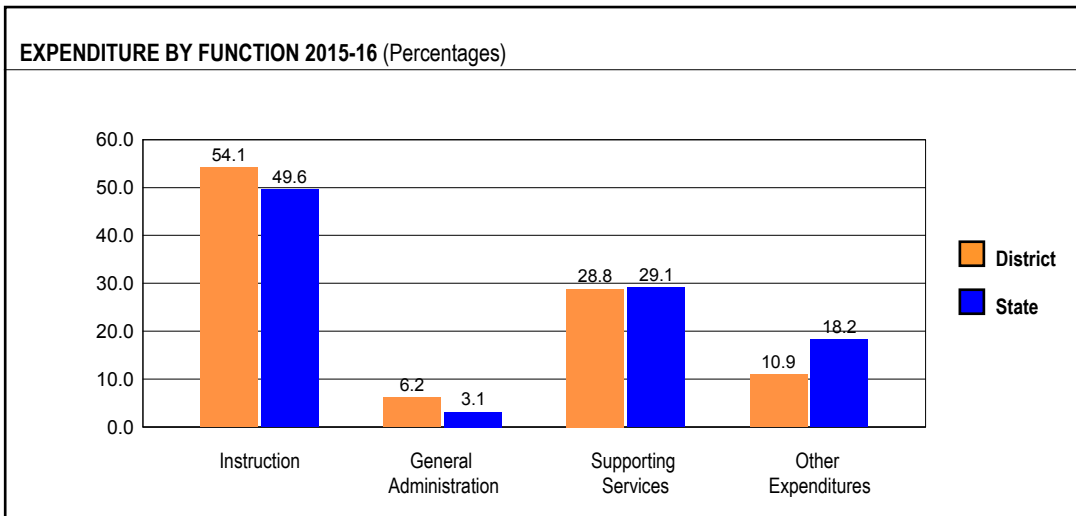
