



From the Desk of the Superintendent

Fict #102 It is with great joy that I write this article in anticipation of the 2021-2022 school year. After serving seven years as principal of Rogers School, I look forward to continuing my partnership with District 102 as the new superintendent. Prior to

working in school administration, I worked in the classroom as a substitute, paraprofessional, teacher and interventionist. My husband and I both grew up in Central Illinois and now call Mapleton home. We enjoy spending time with our three children or watching them participate in a music performance or game.

As we approach the start of the 2021-2022 school year, there are many changes and updates to note within the District. First of all, with the building consolidation, Marquette School will now house students in Pre-K through third grade. Students in grades four through eight will attend Georgetowne School, where five classrooms and a speech/language therapy room have been remodeled to accommodate the addition of students. Custodial and maintenance staff spent the month of June preparing rooms and moving instructional materials from Rogers to the other two buildings. Additionally, library staff worked to reconfigure our selection of books to meet the needs of our readers at both Marquette and Georgetowne. Administration and teachers spent time coordinating procedures to accommodate the changes to our student attendance centers. Grant funding sources allowed for the replacement of remaining outdated Smartboards and 60 expired student Chromebooks.

Though much planning has taken place to prepare for the start of the school year, there are still some unknowns. Specific guidance from the Illinois State Board of Education and the Illinois Department of Public Health regarding safe school practices during Phase 5 is still forthcoming. At this time, we do know that ISBE unanimously adopted a resolution supporting fully in-person learning for the 2021-2022 school year, with remote instruction being made available for students who are both not eligible for a COVID-19 vaccine AND are under a quarantine order by a local public health department or the Illinois Department of Public Health. Additionally, in a joint webinar with ISBE and the Illinois Department of Public Health mid-June, it was suggested that masks, social distancing and contact tracing will remain in some capacity. More information is expected by mid-July and will be communicated accordingly.

Pre-Kindergarten at Risk Screening

District 102 Special Services

North Pekin-Marquette Heights District 102 offers a continuum of services to meet the needs of diverse learners. Programs and services, including those to address speech, learning and/ or developmental delays, are offered by the district to children age three and older. The District complies with The U.S. Department of Education & #39;s Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973. If you, as a parent, have concerns for your child in any of these areas or feel an evaluation may be warranted, please contact the appropriate school office to set up an appointment to discuss your concerns.

Annual Asbestos Management Plan Notice

This is to inform you of the status of the North Pekin-Marquette Heights District 102 asbestos management plans. It has been determined by the Illinois Department of Public Health and the Federal Environmental Protection Agency that asbestos is a potential health hazard, and precautions should be taken to avoid disturbing any asbestos containing materials. As required, our buildings were initially inspected for asbestos in December, 1987. The AHERA law requires that a visual inspection of asbestos containing areas be completed every six months, and a reinspection conducted every three years. The district's three-year inspection occurred in July, 2019. Any evidence of disturbance or change in condition will be documented in the Management plan as required. The Inspection/Management Plan is available for public review in the District Office located at Georgetowne Middle School, 51 Yates Rd., Marquette Heights. Should you wish to review the plans, please call to make an appointment during normal business hours.

Registration fees for 2021-2022

Book Fees are waived for the 2021-2022 school year.

Georgetowne Middle School has additional fees for electives or activities that will also be assessed according to specific class assignments. Also, the Board of Education will require students to wear a gown during Eighth Grade Graduation. A fee will be assessed during registration of \$25.00 to cover this cost.

Students wishing to participate in any of the following Georgetowne school activities are required to pay the following participation fees:

\$25.00 for Literary, Scholastic Bowl and Student Council.

\$50.00 for Baseball, Softball, Basketball, Cheerleading, Pom Pons, Volleyball, Track and Cross Country.

Maximum charge per student is \$75.00 and \$150 per family.

All Athletic fees may be waived by the building principal for those approved for a "Waiver of Fees."

Marquette Students will have an additional activity fee to offset the costs of magazines, take home folders and a journal for 1st grade students.

The Parent Portal requires the use of Google Chrome, Mozilla 1.6+, Firefox 1.0+ or Microsoft Windows Internet Explorer 6.x. Most phones do not work when trying to register on-line. Parents will still need to come to registration to receive information and turn in physicals. Registration will be held in the Georgetowne Library. "Physical and Immunization Requirements" are some information that will help speed up the registration process. Please read it over and bring all the necessary information with you when you come to register.

CERTIFICATE OF LIVE BIRTH

All kindergarten students and new students to the district are required to provide a Certificate of Live Birth. This can be obtained through the courthouse of the county in which the child was born. The copy from the hospital is not considered a Certificate of Live Birth. Some students who do not have a birth certificate on file may be asked to obtain a **Certificate of Live Birth** as stated in the student's handbook. **This is due into the district no later than the first day of school.**

ALL PHYSICAL AND DENTAL EXAMINATIONS SHOULD BE DATED AFTER SEPTEMBER 1, 2020.

ALL PHYSICALS AND IMMUNIZATIONS MUST BE INTO THE DISTRICT NO LATER THAN OCTOBER 15, 2021 OR YOUR CHILD WILL BE EXCLUDED FROM SCHOOL.



PHYSICAL AND IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

ALL kindergarten and sixth grade students are required to have a physical and dental examination upon entering school. All Second grade students are required to have a dental examination upon entering school. The following information is what the health department requires for these students to be in compliance.

KINDERGARTEN REQUIREMENTS

DTP/DTaP– FOUR OR FIVE SHOTS WITH THE LAST ONE AFTER THE FOURTH BIRTHDAY

POLIO – THREE OR FOUR SHOTS WITH THE LAST ONE AFTER THE FOURTH BIRTHDAY

MMR – TWO SHOTS GIVEN AFTER THE CHILD IS 15 MONTHS OLD

VARICELLA - CHICKEN POX, IMMUNIZATION OR PROOF OF DISEASE

HIB B- 1 DOSE AT 15 MONTHS OR OLDER -NOT REQUIRED AFTER 5TH BIRTHDAY

PNEUMOCOCCAL CONJUGATE—1 DOSE AFTER 24 MONTHS - NOT REQUIRED AFTER 5TH BIRTHDAY

DIABETES AND LEAD SCREENINGS ARE NOW MANDATORY

Health Examinations

Public Act 95-0422, effective August 24, 2007, revised the School Code such as that a health examination is required before entering the sixth grade of any public, private, or parochial school as opposed to entering the fifth grade of any public, private, or parochial school.

Dental Exams

Illinois Administrative Code requires all children in kindergarten, second and sixth grades of any public, private, parochial school to have a dental examination.

Vision Requirements for Illinois Students

- Vision screenings are mandatory for second and eighth grade students
- Vision screenings are recommended for grades 4, 6, 10, and 12
- Pediatric color screening is now recommended for second grade, rather than first
- Photo screening has been approved for children under 3 and for children who cannot be screened with traditional screening methods

Vision Examinations

Public Act 95-671, effective Tuesday, January 1, 2008, requires that all children enrolling in kindergarten in a public, private or parochial school and any student enrolling for the first time in a public, private or parochial school shall have an eye examination.

Each such child is to present proof of having been examined by a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches or a licensed optometrist within the previous year before the start of school on August 18, 2021.

BLOOD LEAD POISONING SCREENING REQUIREMENTS

The Blood Lead Poisoning Prevention Act (Public Act #87-1144) requires physicians to screen children, ages six months to six years of age, for lead poisoning. By January 1, 1993, each day care center, day care home, preschool, nursery school, kindergarten or other child care facility, licensed or approved by the State, including such programs operated by a public school district, shall include a requirement that each parent or legal guardian of a child between the ages of six months through six years provide a statement from a physician or health care provider that the child has been screened for lead poisoning. The law requires that this statement shall be provided prior to admission and subsequently, in conjunction with, required physical examinations. The Tazewell County Health Department will provide blood lead testing to those who qualify. Breakfast Program Continues for 2021-2022 School Year

All three District 102 schools will serve breakfast starting Wednesday, August 18, 2021. The basic menu is the same as last school year: Choice of 3 cereals, 3 different muffins, variety of juices and white milk

Hot breakfast will be available periodically this year. Notices and menus regarding hot breakfast will be posted to our website (www.dist102.org).

The cost for breakfast - hot or cold - is \$0.00 for regular and \$.00 for reduced. Extra muffins and juice may be purchased for \$.45 each. Extra cereal may be purchased. (Not available at Marquette Elementary School) Students who qualify for free lunch will also qualify for free breakfast. Students pay daily. We also ask that lunch money and breakfast money be kept separate and that no child has more than \$14.75 in breakfast and lunch charges.

Thanks go to the Scholarship Committee for managing the scholarship fund's deposits. This allows 100% of the donations to go directly to the scholars.


